






# Welcome to Hakodate!







From the foot of Mt. Hakodate, numerous roads lead to the city and its port.

**AREA** 

These roads are a living encyclopedia of Hakodate's history, speaking volumes about this city that prospered from the Edo period to the Meiji period and whose legacy continues to the present day. Ranks of historic buildings along each road symbolize Hakodate's prosperity. Broad, straight lines offer silent lessons about the dangers of great fires, while the steep lanes and thoroughfares of the Motomachi area preserve the shape of Hakodate's golden era.

# Hijikata Toshizo



The most famous man in the history of Goryokaku is surely Hijikata Toshizo.Known as the "Demon Vice-Commander" of the Shinsengumi, GORYOKAKU a paramilitary force of the Tokugawa Shogunate, Hijikata died in action at the Battle of Hakodate (1868–1869). This battle was the final act of the Boshin War, by which the new Imperial government defeated the remnants of the Shogunate army.



The Goryokaku area, which embraces Goryokaku Park and Goryokaku Tower, forms the heart of Hakodate. Arrayed in the shape of a five-pointed star, Goryokaku Park changes dynamically in aspect from season to season, from cherry blossoms in spring to illuminations in winter.





Yunokawa Hot Spring Resort 2

Yunokawa Hot Spring Resort is one of the pre-eminent hot spring areas in Hokkaido. Nearby is Japan's first Christian convent, the Trappistine Convent, established in 1898. You'll also find Yukura Shrine, a Shinto shrine with over 300 years of history. Yunokawa is richly endowed with historic locations of a strikingly different character than those of Hakodate's west side.

At Hakodate Tropical Botanical Garden, from December to early May you can watch Japanese monkeys soaking contentedly in the hot springs. It is heart-warming to see the monkeys soak in the hot springs to withstand the cold and blowing snow of winter, just as humans do.

"千畳敷, Senjoiiki",the name of place is composed of 3 Japanese charac-



ters."千, Sen"means 1,000,"畳, jo"means Japanese traditional floor mats called tatami which is made of straw and rush,"敷, jiki" means spreading. Literally, the place is called so because of its huge area where around 1,000 pieces of tatami can be spread out. It might be a good idea to bring a lunch box with you on a sunny day!



# Tachimachimisaki Cape 4

"立待岬, Tachimachimisaki"the name of place is composed of 3 Japanese letters. The first one,"立, Tachi", means standing. The

second one, "待, machi", means ambushing. The last one, "岬, misaki", means a cape. Once Ainu, indigenous people of Hokkaido, stood and ambushed fish to catch on this cape. So please visit there to see the beautiful sight!





The trip from the boarding platform of the Mt. Hakodate Ropeway to the summit takes about 3 minutes.

Hours of operation: First ascent: 10:00AM Last ascent: 9:50PM Last descent: 10:00PM

(From October 16 to April 24: Last ascent: 8:50PM Last descent: 9:00PM)

You can also reach the summit by the Hakodate Tozan bus, a 30-minute ride from JR Hakodate Station to the peak (operates from late April to mid-November).

If you wish to drive to the top of Mt. Hakodate, please note that the roads are closed in winter, and even in summer access may be restricted at certain times of day. For details please visit Travel Hakodate (http://www.hakodate.travel/en), the official tourist-information website.



Hakodate Jomon Culture Center [Exhibition Room 2]

In 1975 a farmer in Minamikayabe unearthed an unexpected object; a hollow clay figure named "Kakku" later. Since then it has revealed a lot of information about the people living in the Jomon era (approximately 15,000 BC to 300 BC). It is Hokkaido's first national treasure, and it is usually on display at the Jomon Cultural Center.



### Mt.Esan: Active Volcano

This is the symbolic mountain of Esan Prefectural Natural Park.Mt.Esan is missing half of its shape because it collapsed due to an eruption about 2,500 years ago. Rhododendron kaempferi and 60 types of alpine plant bloom here in spring. In addition, the landscape is colored with the fall leaves of redvein enkianthus in late October.



### Esantsutsuji Park

This place, where many Rhododendron kaempferi originally grew wild, was developed into a park in the late 1970s / early 1980s. It is said that about 600,000 Rhododendron kaempferi bloom red in full glory over Mt.Esan as a whole, including Azalea Park, in spring. Many tourists visit to see this.

Scattered along Route 278 are villages that have existed for centuries. Toi, off which some of Japan's finest tuna are caught; Esan and Todohokke, verdant communities designated as prefectural natural parks; and Minamikayabe, where the nation's best kombu is harvested and dried. Hemmed between sea and mountains, this region is the distilled essence of the charm of Hakodate.





Perched on the southernmost tip of the island, Matsumae is Hokkaido's only castle town. Its park has some 10,000 cherry trees, which bloom spectacularly between the end of April and early May. If you want to escape from the hustle and bustle of city life, Matsumae is a great place to go!

The opening of Kikonai Station on the Hokkaido Shinkansen has brought an air of excitement to Kikonai. Michi-no-Eki Misogi-no-Sato Kikonai, which opened at the same time, has grabbed attention as a new gourmet and shopping attraction.



For a small, isolated town, Esashi has experienced periods of great prosperity and drama. It once hosted a thriving herring fishery, and the sinking of the warship Kaiyo Maru there marked its involvement in the Meiji Restoration. You can see and experience reminders of these times at Kamome-jima and in the town center.


# **Shikabe**


